IEI Day and Exposition marked

Institute celebrates its growth and success

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 23: "From time immemorial RUWAIT CITY, Oct 23: "From time immemorial India has been the nerve center of scientific, social, political and economic power in the world," Chairman of the Institution of Engineers (IEI) — Kuwait Chapter, Eng. Joseph Panicker said in his welcome speech to mark the celebration of IEI Day and Exposition in memory of Sir M. Visvesvaraya who was an outstanding Engineer statesman of India

Addressing the gathering at the Ramada Hotel Panicker said the IEI — the largest multidisciplinary engineering professional society — was founded in Calcuta in 1920 to promote and advance science and technology in the country.

The Royal Charter was granted to the Institute in 1935 by His Majesty King George V. The Institute has been the founder member of World Energy Council (WEC) in 1924, the Commonwealth Engineers Council (CEC) in 1946 and World Federation of Engineers Organization (WFEO), and many more, he added.

He disclosed the IEI will host the Engineering

Congress from Nov 15 to Nov 18 this year. He said he has received many enquiries from Kuwait engineers who are keen to attend this event.

He added, "The IEI is proud of its growth over the years. The IEI, he said, has bilateral relationship with 24 foreign engineering institutions in countries such as the United States, the UK, Japan and Germany. In the Middle East "we have six overseas chapters — Abu Dhabi, Bahrain, Dubai, Qatar, and Sydney," he disclosed. In Kuwait the IEI has entered into an agreement with the Kuwait Society of Engineers for technical cooperation.

The Kuwait Chapter was established in 1995. The Engineers Day celebration is the largest of its kind in Middle East and in many countries and is the largest held in this region, he noted.

He added it is heartening to see the Kuwait Chapter is being closely associated with Kuwait Society of Engineers, the Ministry of Higher Education, the Volunteers Work Center, the Kuwait Science Club, the Environment Protection Society,

Science Club, the Environment Protection Society, and various ministries. This is possible mainly due to the warm and close relationship of India with Kuwait over the years.

He said the Voluntary Work Center, through their

philanthropic programs has not only attracted the attention of Kuwaitis but also expatriates. The relationship of the IEI Kuwait Chapter with the VWC is warm and "we are partners with them in many areas of common interest."
